It is finally time for me to show off my great city. For those of you who were here for AG Bell in June...sorry for the rain; I put a special request 'in' for terrific weather...we'll see if I've been a good girl this year (I asked Santa and God)!

REGISTRATION and MEMBERSHIP

In this Newsletter you will find a 'virtual' registration and membership form. It is 'virtual' because ALL registrations and payments will be done electronically through PAYPAL this year. It makes it so much more convenient for you and for Margaret who will be able to bring her records on a flashdrive instead of in huge binders ©! Please note that there are only 2 payment levels: early registration MUST be done by December 15 (\$190). After that date the regular fee will be charged (\$225). Also, do note that the preconference session Thursday morning is FREE this year.

HOTEL

The hotel information- Sheraton Station Square - is part of the registration form and your hotel accommodations can also be done through a secure website. PLEASE do use the site, no more waiting on hold for reservations, wondering if they can find ACE-DHH under 'groups', and errors in registration or payment details. Remember that you will get free wireless Internet in your rooms and the common areas of the hotel and if you are within driving distance of Pittsburgh (and many of you are), in-out parking privileges in the garage across from the hotel. A block of rooms is available from Wednesday night through Saturday night (single/double \$112-triple \$127-quad \$142).

TRANSPORTATION

For those of you flying in, there is a shuttle available every 15 minutes that will take you to the hotel. The Shuttle desk is located in the car rental area of the airport in front of the elevators on the baggage claim level. HOWEVER, if you let me know your arrival time and enough of you come in around the same time, I can arrange for an ACE-DHH private shuttle at a reduced rate for your transportation. Please let me know (deeklein@iup.edu) NO LATER than February 1 and I will get back to you and let you know if a private shuttle will be provided for you. The regular rate for EXPRESS Shuttle is \$18.00 one-way.

FOOD

The reception will be THURSDAY EVENING this year to give you time to 'play' in the 'Burgh on Friday night. Be it cultural, comedy, sports, jazz, or Margaritaville, there is something for you to do in Pittsburgh Friday night. The Banquet will be Saturday evening as usual with time to spare for another evening in town if you wish.
